

Medication and Health Services

- Please note if you indicated on Child Health Assessment Form that your child will be taking medication at school, please be vigilant that the medication is available from your school. For more information, please visit www.jefco.edu/parents/childnursing
- If your child requires any medication, please bring it to the school. The school has medication storage at a locked cabinet for transport (Such as an Ambulance)
- If your child needs an over-the-counter medication, please bring it to the school. The school has a locked cabinet for transport. The medication must be signed by the parent. The "Medication Authorization Form" is signed by a doctor. OTC meds must be in the original package. Do not bring medication in Ziploc bags, envelopes, etc.
- If your child takes a prescription medication, please bring it to the school. The "Medication Authorization Form" must be completed and signed by the doctor. The medication must be in the original package, labeled by the doctor, and must include the child's name, the medication, and the dose. Do not bring inhalers.
- If your child requires an over-the-counter medication, please bring it to the school. The school has a locked cabinet for transport. The medication must be signed by the parent. The "Medication Authorization Form" is signed by a doctor. OTC meds must be in the original package. Do not bring medication in Ziploc bags, envelopes, etc.
- If your child has a fever (temperature of 100.4 or higher), please bring it to the school. The school has a locked cabinet for transport. The medication must be signed by the parent.
